

TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR VISITORS OF FIELDLAB EVENTS



Terms & Conditions

In view of the fact that this is a Fieldlab event, access for people belonging to a risk group as described by the RIVM is not possible.

Visitors to a pilot event / practical test within Fieldlab declare that they are willing (by purchasing an admission ticket or registering for the event) to meet a number of conditions. The visitor gives permission to participate in the research associated with Fieldlab events, whereby the participant is free to opt out at any time by leaving the event and at that time to stop the tracking and remove possible Apps from their smartphone .

The research

Fieldlab investigates through video observation and the wearing of tags or downloading tracker software how the number and duration of contacts can be influenced by logistical adjustments within the event or physical adaptation of the environment. In addition, participants receive questions via the communication App and the observation is used to record the natural behaviour of the participants e.g. in following directions.

Prior to the event

- After registering or purchasing a ticket, the visitor downloads the Close app for communication purposes
- The visitor is tested in advance, by means of a rapid test on the day of the event, maximum 24 hours before the end of the event
- The rapid tests are free and take place at one of the locations designated by Fieldlab Evenementen. Participants are asked to have a test taken as close to home as possible.
- The link for scheduling the test and the details of the location will follow a few days before the event via the Close App. When performing the test, registration is necessary and in accordance with Dutch guidelines, also for reporting to and source and contact investigation by the GGD in the event of an unexpected positive result.
- Should the visitor have a positive test for COVID-19, he or she will not come to the event, but will immediately go into quarantine.
- The visitor answers the health declaration truthfully, within 4 hours before the event
- If the visitor answers yes to one of the questions in the health declaration, he or she will not come to the event
- Every visitor must be personally registered, even if the ticket has been purchased by someone else and can be contacted directly by the organization.
- The visitor follows the instructions by the organization, both instructions given by mail / app or otherwise prior to, during and after the event, as well as instructions given personally by representatives of the organization.
- The visitor adheres to the RIVM guidelines as they apply to daily traffic (1.5 m distance, mouth mask, group size, etc.)

During the event

- If the visitor is asked to take a rapid test and / or temperature measurement, he / she will cooperate
- At the request of the organization, the visitor wears protective measures such as a mouth mask, or omits the protective measure, depending on the request from the organization, whereby the visitor may always take protective measures of their own choice if he / she so wishes.
- The visitors can be divided into a bubble or a fixed group. The visitor declares that he will remain in this bubble during the presence at the pilot event and will not be among other groups.
- The visitor is aware that, contrary to the RIVM rules, he / she may be asked to come closer to other people than 1.5 m, not to wear a mouth mask or to exceed the maximum group size.
- The visitor is given a tag or other means of detection to register his / her movements. This will be worn throughout the event and returned when leaving the event or may then be removed from the smartphone.
- The visitor can be followed by observation or video analysis and declares that he is willing to use these images for analysis purposes
- In addition to the video for analysis purposes, image recordings (photo / video) can also be made of the pilot for media or other purposes. The visitor gives the right to use these images
- The visitor agrees to the fact that all collected data and video images are used for anonymous analysis purposes for scientific research.
- If the visitor of the organization receives special requests for behaviour during the event, he / she will follow up on these requests as much as possible. Requests can be, for example: going to a specific catering point during the break or rest, sitting down during the break or rest, etc.

After the event

- Immediately after leaving the event site, the visitor again adheres to the RIVM guidelines as they apply to daily traffic (1.5 m distance, mouth mask, group size, etc.).
- In the period after the event (ten days), the visitor takes into account that no vulnerable groups will be visited, until the visitor has a negative COVID test result.
- The visitor is tested afterwards, five days after the end of the event
- The rapid tests are free and take place at one of the locations designated by Fieldlab Events. Participants are asked to have a test taken as close to home as possible.
- The link for scheduling the test and the details of the location will follow a few days before the event via the Close App. When performing the test, registration is necessary and in accordance with Dutch guidelines, also for reporting to and source and contact investigation by the GGD in the event of an unexpected positive result.
- Should the visitor show complaints earlier than day 5 or afterwards, the participant will have himself tested via the GGD. The GGD is informed that they have participated in a Fieldlab event and, if desired, permission is given to pass on the test result to the Fieldlab physician.
- The visitor participates in various surveys via the Close app, which for this purpose can be found on the visitor's phone at least three weeks after the event.
- The data that is stored is processed anonymously for the purpose of scientific analysis. In addition to these conditions, the general conditions of the organizer of the event apply. These can be found in the additional information for the relevant event

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Possible risks

Despite entrance tests and health checks, it cannot be ruled out that someone infected will be admitted to the event. Based on literature, previous studies and expert opinion, it is estimated that we recognize 95% of all infectious people beforehand and do not give them access to Fieldlab events.

During the first ten events under Fieldlab, the percentage of infectious people actually found was 0.65%, whereby nothing could be said about the degree of infectivity.

Given the amount of contacts measured during the first events, the risk for a participant varies from 0.8 - 1.2 per 100,000 per hour for a low contact event (theater, cinema, congress) to 1.0 - 3.4 per 100,000 per hour for an indoor dance / concert or for a high contact event (festival). By way of comparison, the risk of the average Dutch person at the time of the first events was 1.42 per 100,000 or 5.55 per 100,000 for someone who receives visitors at home. We put it here without appreciation but for participants to form their own image of the chance of becoming infected.

Although infections with SARS-CoV-2 rarely lead to serious illness in our main target group (young people), COVID-19 can exceptionally also have long-term consequences in this group, such as fatigue, concentration problems, etc.

Liability

As indicated above, the applicable RIVM measures will be abandoned for the purpose of the investigation by Fieldlab Events. The visitor agrees to the fact that no liability arises from this for possible contamination with the Covid-19 virus.
